FY 2015 Community Benefit Summary

\$174,212,832 were documented for Children's Mercy activities during FY2015

Financial Assistance at Cost (Formerly Charity Care) – Includes free and discounted inpatient and outpatient care to persons who meet the eligibility criteria of our financial assistance policies

Unreimbursed Medicaid and Other Government Programs – Includes unreimbursed costs from providing care to patients enrolled in government health programs

Community Health Improvement Services – These activities are carried out to improve community health and include community health education, outreach and prevention services

Health Professions Education – Includes all educational programs the organization is involved with that result in degrees or training necessary to practice as a health professional

Subsidized Health Services – Includes clinical services that are provided despite a financial loss because they meet a community need

Research – Includes studies or investigations designed to generate knowledge that will be made available to the public

Cash and In-Kind Donations – Includes contributions made by the organization that support community benefit activities provided by others

Community-Building Activities – These activities seek to address root causes of health problems, such as poverty, homelessness and environmental hazards

Community Benefit Operations – Includes the cost of assigned staff, consultants and activities of the community benefit department/team, such as community assessments and program evaluations and community benefit planning
