Charity Care – Includes free and discounted inpatient and outpatient care to persons who meet the eligibility criteria of our financial assistance policies

Unreimbursed Medicaid and other government programs – Includes unreimbursed costs from providing care to patients enrolled in government health programs

Community health improvement services - These activities are carried out to improve community health and

include community health education, outreach and prevention services

Health professions education – Includes all educational programs the organization is involved with that result in degrees or training necessary to practice as a health professional

Subsidized health services – Includes clinical services that are provided despite a financial loss because they meet a community need

Research – Includes studies or investigations designed to generate knowledge that will be made available to the public
