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# 2011 Community Benefit Summary

\$143,538,230 were documented for CMH activities in 2011

**Charity Care** – Includes free and discounted inpatient and outpatient care to persons who meet the eligibility criteria of our financial assistance policies

**Unreimbursed Medicaid and other government programs** – Includes unreimbursed costs from providing care to patients enrolled in government health programs

**Community health improvement services** – These activities are carried out to improve community health and include community health education, outreach and prevention services

**Health professions education** – Includes all educational programs the organization is involved with that result in degrees or training necessary to practice as a health professional

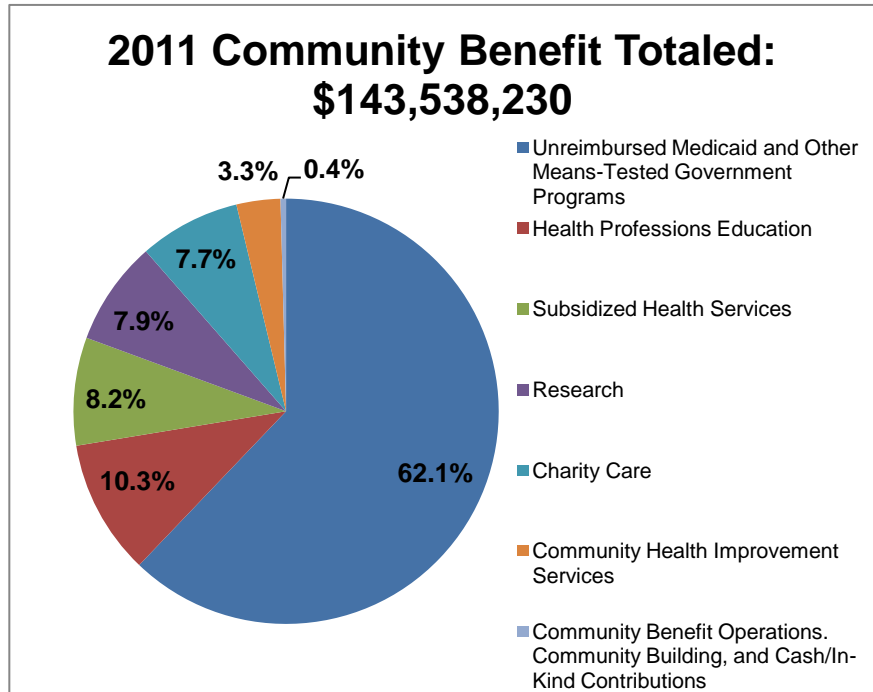
**Subsidized health services** – Includes clinical services that are provided despite a financial loss because they meet a community need

**Research** – Includes studies or investigations designed to generate knowledge that will be made available to the public

**Cash and in-kind donations** – Includes contributions made by the organization that support community benefit activities provided by others

**Community-building activities** – These activities seek to address root causes of health problems, such as poverty, homelessness and environmental hazards

**Community benefit operations** – Includes the cost of assigned staff, consultants and activities of the community benefit department/team, such as community assessments and program evaluations and community benefit planning
