Dr. Katharine Berry Richardson (left), a surgeon, along with her sister Dr. Alice Berry Graham, the dentist, began caring for a little 6year-old girl in 1897. It was then that they began the Women's and Children's Hospital, which became Mercy Hospital (now Children's Mercy Hospitals and Clinics). Dr. Richardson headed the children's hospital until her death in 1933. The then student Katharine Berry Richardson is number 17.
