# Meet Kit: From Chemo to Kindergarten Thanks to Research and Personalized Medicine



*Kit and her family cherish 'simple every day moments.'*



"Childhood cancer isn't just bald kids beaming down from billboards," Mary Kate said. "Simple, every day moments now aren't 'every day' to us. We cherish each one as part of Kit's healing."

Thankfully, scientific investigation and personalized medicine helped save Kit's life. Committed to finding answers for children and families, Children's Mercy will also never stop asking questions ... questions like, "What if Kit and her family didn't have to lose that time while she struggled through heart-wrenching pain? What if childhood diseases like the acute lymphoblastic leukemia that invaded Kit's tiny body were eliminated and children didn't have to suffer at all? What if her family never had to say, 'She's still not out of the woods' and wonder and worry every single day?"

Kit doesn't remember life without chemotherapy. For good reason.

The 5-year-old just started kindergarten this fall after her first chemo-free summer in more than two years. Since age 3, Kit has endured more than 20 spinal taps, multiple blood transfusions, surgeries and dozens of hospital admissions. She spent 859 days undergoing chemotherapy at Children's Mercy and finished her final treatment on June 17.

"Kit received the best possible cancer care we could've imagined. Children's Mercy is a true gem we're so very lucky to have here," said Mary Kate Van Sickle, Kit's mom.

Still, parents Mary Kate and Corey stress that the journey has not been all roses. Open sores on Kit's little fingers and toes and detached nails were painful side effects of monthly chemotherapies she received via a chest port. Periodically, she had to undergo anesthetic for a lumbar puncture that injected chemo into her spinal fluid.

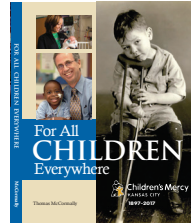

## Driven to find answers

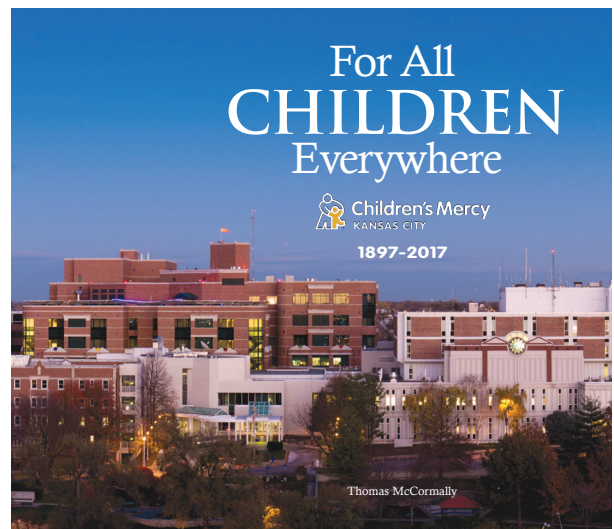
The good news about annual reports like this one is that they provide an opportunity to assess our progress. But sometimes, numbers alone can be a bit overwhelming:

- 500,000 patient visits.
- 20,000 surgeries.
- 200,000 emergency room visits.

While we report these, that's not where our focus is. Instead, Children's Mercy keeps its collective eyes on the individual children we serve. Consider Kit, the 5-year-old cancer survivor profiled on page 2. We look at each family and ask "How can we help you?" We seek answers one by one.

Fiscal Year 2017 was a remarkable year for Children's Mercy. This annual report brings you the highlights, shares some of the stories and displays the facts and figures. More than that, it seeks to portray the compassion and dedication of our staff, the gratitude we have for your amazing support and the commitment to a future of hope and healing.

This past year, we celebrated our 120th birthday. It was in June 1897 that our founders, Katharine Berry Richardson, a surgeon, and her older sister Alice Berry Graham, a dentist, picked up a sick little girl from the streets of Kansas City, took her to a rented bed in a women's hospital, and brought her back to health. You can read more about that story, and many others, in our new history book, "For All Children Everywhere."



Don't think of the book as an ending. With 120 years behind us, we're only getting started!

As we looked back, it became clear how these two remarkable women paved a way forward, a path we continue to follow more than a century later. Katharine was very much an innovator, pursuing alternative treatments when traditional medicine was not effective. She insisted we find a way to take care of all children—no matter their race or religion, their address or their financial situation. She stressed the importance of education for doctors and nurses and dreamed of the transformative power of medical research.

While we are a long way from 1897, the sisters' guiding spirit is still with us. Consider some highlights from 2017:

- New partnerships with Olathe Medical Center and Geary Community Hospital in Junction City, Kan., will allow us to reach even more children, more conveniently, than ever before.
- Tom Curran, PhD, the Executive Director of our Children's Research Institute, and Mike Artman, MD, Chief of Pediatrics at both the University of Missouri-Kansas City and the University of Kansas, were named our first Eminent Scholars, demonstrating an even stronger commitment to medical research and education.
- Our research efforts received boosts from the National Institutes of Health, from corporate sponsors and from philanthropists who endowed more chairs for world-class scientists.

- One of our most successful research efforts—the Cardiac High Acuity Monitoring Program, or CHAMP—not only helped keep some of our sickest patients safe at home with their parents instead of in the hospital between two crucial surgeries, it was also awarded a special 2016 Magnet Prize from the American Nurses Credentialing Center. CHAMP, with help from ANCC, Microsoft and the Claire Giannini Fund, is now spreading to children’s hospitals across the country.
- During the most current year, Children’s Mercy provided more than \$172 million in charity care and unreimbursed costs, including a \$144 million shortfall from Medicaid and other government programs. We also provided more than \$10 million for community health programs.

None of these accomplishments would be possible without the strong support from our community. Almost from its beginning, Children’s Mercy has enjoyed tremendous philanthropic support. “For All Children Everywhere” tells the stories of small children who gave their time, talent and treasures to help. Some of our early donors’ grandchildren and great-children are continuing the tradition.

This past year was a record breaker for philanthropy, with more than \$49 million donated to the hospital. Our Small Change–Big Difference campaign launched a birthday party program, providing children with an easy opportunity to give. Red Hot Night, our winter gala, shattered its previous records to raise more than \$2 million on a cold February night. Just as summer was heating up, the Big Slick Celebrity Weekend brought in \$1.75 million.

This kind of support is vital. All gifts allow Children’s Mercy to be there for children and families that need us. We’ve recently launched our first-ever advertising campaign to remind people just how much we rely on their help, particularly in the uncertain times of health care reform and finance.

The Joint Commission made its accreditation visit to our hospitals in both Kansas and Missouri this year and offered high praise for our staff and facilities. U.S. News & World Report placed Children’s Mercy in all 10 specialties as part of its Best Children’s Hospitals rankings. Staff members were elevated to leadership positions in national medical and nursing organizations.



But, as I said, the numbers can be overwhelming, and only tell part of the story. We like to say that while being named one of the best is an honor, it means more to us to provide care, love and hope. That is a privilege.

One of the great pleasures of my job is meeting children and their families who come to us for help. We do what we do because of them. Here’s a note we received when we asked families to share a bit of their stories for the history book.

“I love Children’s Mercy for so many reasons. I love them because I felt I finally had someone fighting just as hard as I was to help my medically fragile child. I found a sense of belonging ... I stopped fearing the future and started looking forward to watching my child grow.”

It’s a future we can all look forward to, because of you. Thank you.

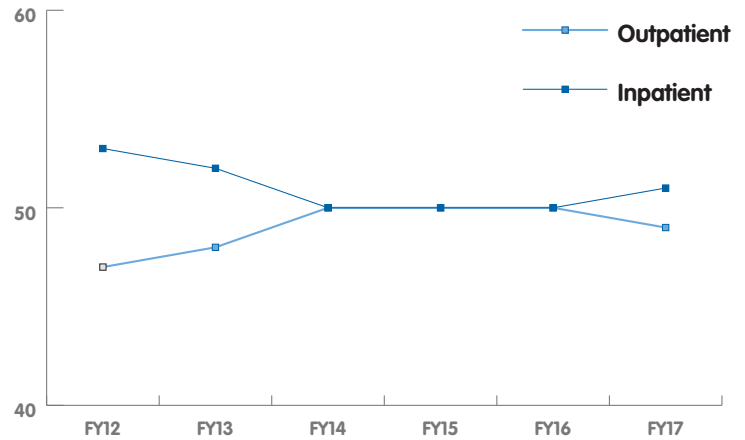

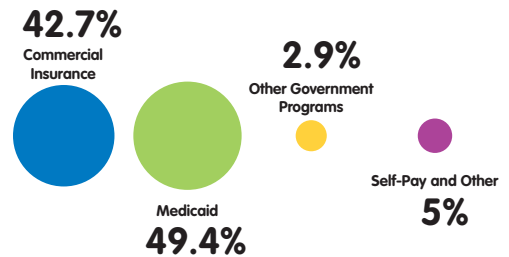

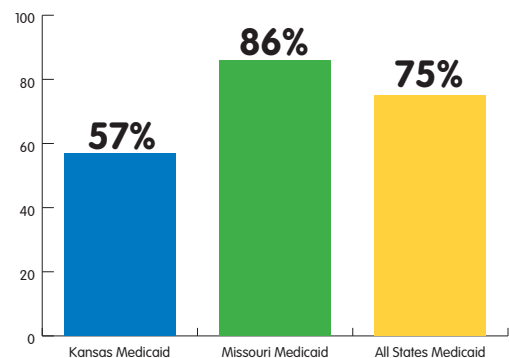
## Outpatient revenue and Inpatient nearly equal

# History points the way toward the future



The new historical display at Children's Mercy Hospital attracted a crowd at its unveiling in June.

There is an old saying that those who don't remember the past are doomed to repeat it. At Children's Mercy, we believe if we remember the past we'll be *lucky* and repeat it.

A history of innovation, compassion, love and caring were highlighted in 2017 as Children's Mercy celebrated the 120th anniversary of its founding. What began with two sisters caring for a single little girl in a rented bed in a dilapidated, dusty women's hospital has grown into a globally recognized leader in pediatric medicine.

Major events to mark the 120th birthday:

- Founding sisters Alice Berry Graham, a dentist, and Katharine Berry Richardson, a surgeon, were inducted into the Starr Women's Hall of Fame at the University of Missouri-Kansas City.
- A new historical display, complete with photos and artifacts, opened on the Adele Hall Campus.
- "For All Children Everywhere," a coffee-table book chronicling 12 decades of Children's Mercy history was published.

In addition to 120 years of Children's Mercy, history also took

center stage as the hospital marked: the 50th anniversary of our continuing medical education symposium, Clinical Advances in Pediatrics; the 30th anniversary of opening what has grown to become Children's Mercy Hospital Kansas; the 10 years since the opening of Children's Mercy West; and five years since the opening of Children's Mercy East.

The story of Children's Mercy—like all good children's stories—is one of hope, troubles and, ultimately, triumph. In "For All Children Everywhere"—available at Children's Mercy Gift Shops and online at [childrensmercy.org/book](http://childrensmercy.org/book) and Amazon—it is described this way:

"This is a love story ... It is about love given to children and parents. And love given by doctors and nurses and all kinds of people who make this children's hospital go ... In these pages you will find the love of a community which, despite changing times and hard times, embraced this idea and did not let the sisters' dream die."

# Dedicated researchers + YOU = new frontiers in pediatric medicine

Children's Mercy research and innovations, and the private investments that make them possible, are changing the world.

Children, particularly those with rare diseases, have been a neglected population in medical research.

- The National Institutes of Health dedicates only five percent of its annual extramural research budget to pediatric research.
- Federal agencies like the NIH provided only 44 percent of the \$86 billion spent on basic research in 2015, according to the National Science Foundation. That's a drop from 70 percent throughout the 1960s and '70s and 61 percent as recently as 2004.

That's why private investment in children's health, and research in particular, is critical. As a leading pediatric teaching hospital that receives generous support from the community, Children's Mercy is in a unique position to improve the future for children ... today.

Our drive to find answers for children and their families motivated us to create the Children's Research Institute where we are assembling many of the world's best and brightest researchers whose sole focus is serving the needs of children.

Tom Curran, PhD, FRS, Executive Director, Chief Scientific Officer and The Donald J. Hall Eminent Scholar in Pediatric Research, joined the Institute in February 2016.

"One of the great things about coming to Kansas City is it is such a great family- and community-based environment, and there is a great tradition of philanthropic support for Children's Mercy. For research, that is critical," said Dr. Curran. "When you study a rare pediatric disease, you have trouble getting grants because the number of patients involved is small. When you argue the impact on patients and families is enormous, that doesn't cut it when it comes to the competitive grant process. So it's essential to fund the initial research process with philanthropic dollars. I call those golden dollars because they allow us to work on the most important opportunities for our kids."

The Children's Research Institute is creating research environment where no boundaries exist between science and medicine. In the quest to find answers to pediatric medicine's most challenging questions, we are collaborating with physicians, scientists, academic colleagues, philanthropic partners and world-class institutions in our community and around the world. This summer, The University of Kansas Cancer Center announced the renewal of its National Cancer Institute designation and the approval of Children's Mercy as an official consortium partner. Children's Mercy joins existing consortium partners, the Stowers Institute for Medical Research and the University of Kansas.

Here are a few Children's Mercy research projects currently changing the lives of children and families in our community and beyond.

### **Clinical Pharmacology and GOLDILOKS**

The Children's Mercy Clinical Pharmacology program and GOLDILOKS are an excellent example of precision medicine and translational research in action.

**GOLDILOKS (Genomic and Ontogeny-Linked Dose Individualization and Clinical Optimization for Kids)** is a research program designed to ensure that children receive the precise dose of medicine they need, when they need it. This research is funded by a \$3.5 million grant from the National Institutes of Health, as well as a grant from the Sarli Family Foundation.

### **CHAMP (Cardiac High Acuity Monitoring Program)**

CHAMP uses an innovative PC tablet-based application that automates and simplifies at-home monitoring for children born with single-ventricle heart defect and their families. Developed by Children's Mercy researchers, the CHAMP App is the first of its kind for home interstage monitoring. The app allows parents and the medical team to track everything from the child's oxygen saturation levels to nutritional status.

Children's Mercy has funding to provide national distribution for 400 Surface tablets, which would cover 800 patients a year for the typical six-month monitoring periods between the two critical surgeries for babies with hypoplastic left heart syndrome. This is made possible through two lead grants from the Claire Giannini Fund.

### **Bronchopulmonary Disorders (BPD)**

The Donald Thibeault Neonatal Laboratories and the Center for Infant Pulmonary Disorders at Children's Mercy has funding from the National Institutes of Health, as well as the Cooper Connor Endowed Fund for Pulmonary Research, to examine the mechanisms by which sepsis in babies contributes to BPD using animal models.

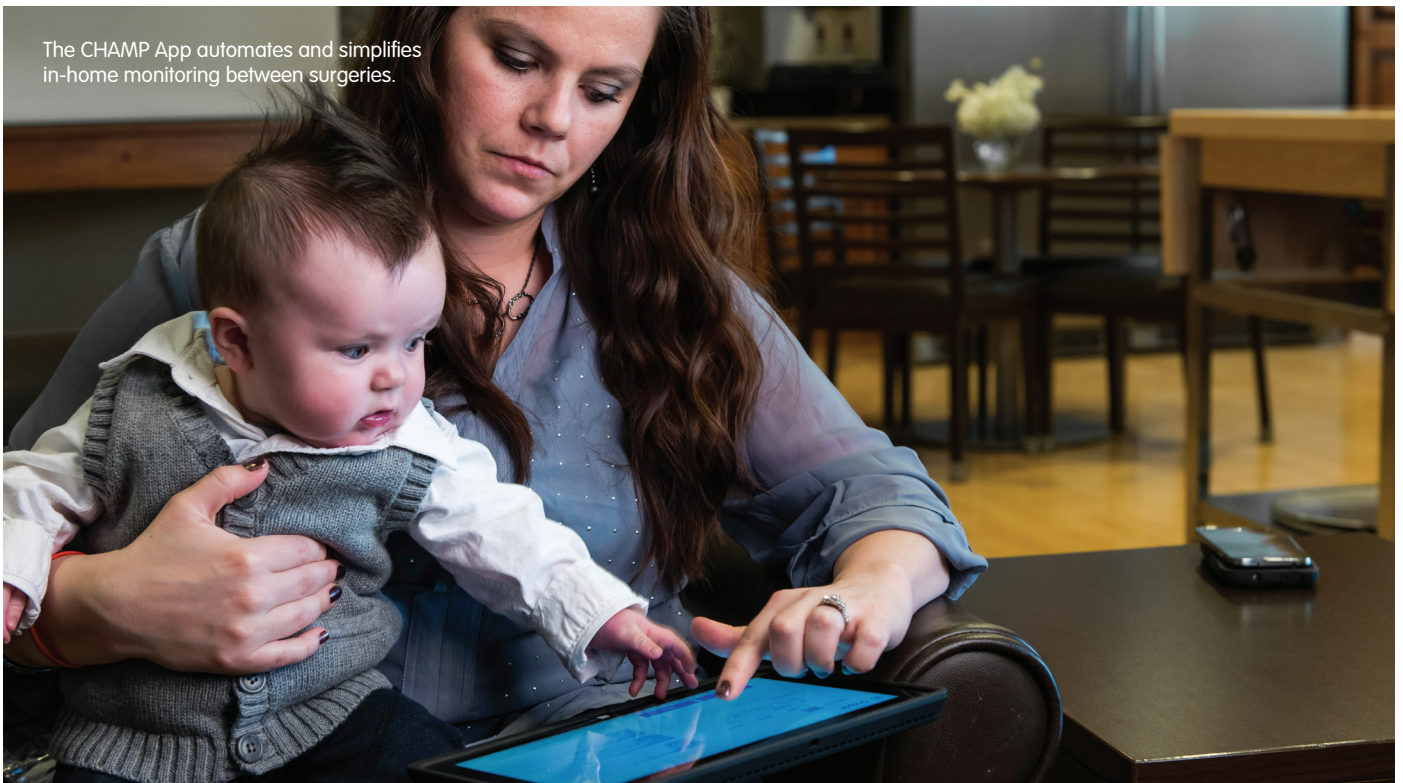
The ability to study BPD from a clinical, translational and basic science perspective is a strength of neonatology at Children's Mercy.

### **The Mercy TAPE**

The Mercy TAPE (**T**AKing the guesswork out of **P**ediatric weight **E**stimation) is a medical device developed by Children's Mercy researchers that, when wrapped around a child's arm, provides accurate weight estimates for children ages 2 months to 16 years. Predicting weight accurately is important to determine appropriate medication dosage, fluid volumes for resuscitation, breathing tube sizes and more.

The Mercy TAPE has practical applications for emergency rooms and rescue squads and is improving the health care and lives of children in less developed settings where scales are not available. Support from The Bresky Foundation helps Children's Mercy distribute The Mercy Tape to health care providers around the world.

The CHAMP App automates and simplifies in-home monitoring between surgeries.





# Center for Community Connections helps address family social needs

It's not as though the problem isn't clear. A home with mold sabotages asthma treatment, a child can't be on a ventilator in a home with no electricity, keeping clinic appointments is tough without transportation, and it's hard to adhere to medication schedules in the midst of being evicted.

It's just that health care teams don't always have the resources needed to address the stressful living situations patients' families are facing and their effect on a child's treatment plan.

But for patients of the Children's Mercy Clinics on Broadway, help is at hand, thanks to the new Children's Mercy Center for Community Connections.

"Some patients' social needs are overwhelming to a point that it interferes with access to care and adherence to treatment," said Jeffrey Colvin, MD, JD, Beacon Clinic Physician and the CCC's Medical Director. "It's difficult for a family to follow a treatment plan when they're worried about where they're going to sleep that night."

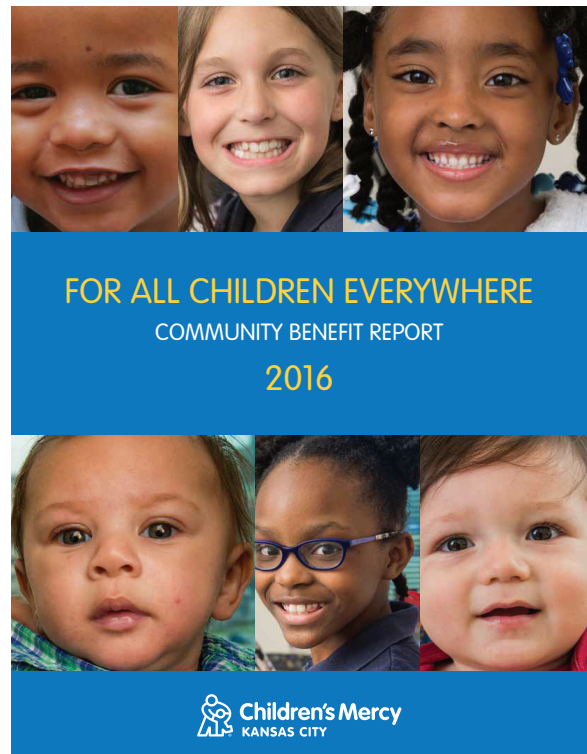
Dr. Colvin and Heather Brungardt, MSW, LCSW, Senior Administrative Director for Psychosocial Services, proposed the CCC as a way to address the social issues that impede patient health outcomes. It serves a growing number of families referred from the clinics at Children's Mercy Broadway.

There are three full-time social workers helping families navigate both Children's Mercy services and resources in the community.

The connections they make go beyond agency names and phone numbers on a list. It's intensive case management. The social workers strive to understand and help resolve the multiple barriers families are experiencing, so that health and wellness for the entire family can be achieved.

Many of the services families need have on-site presence. Families can meet with an attorney and paralegals from Kansas Legal Services, pick up car seats, bike helmets and gun locks, or meet with a behavioral health therapist. Sites for Children's Mercy home visiting programs, Healthy Families and Teams for Infants Endangered by Substance Abuse (TIES), are nearby.

"The CCC is the physical space that connects families to their communities. Through collaboration with the Kansas City Care Clinic, community care workers are on-site and embedded in the Broadway Primary Care Clinic to help Missouri HealthNet Home patients' families navigate health and social services where they live," Brungardt said.

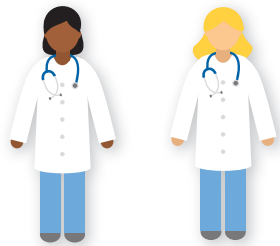

# Community Benefit exceeds \$215 million

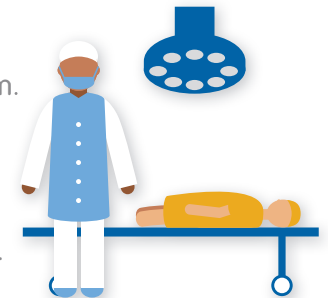
As a nonprofit pediatric hospital, our bottom line is kids—this means that any positive hospital margins are reinvested into the health and well-being of children. Translating that work into numbers isn't easy, but in Fiscal Year 2016 (the most recent year for which numbers are available), Children's Mercy recorded more than \$215 million in "community benefit" activities—that is, activities we conducted as a hospital that went beyond caring for patients and made an impact on our community at large.

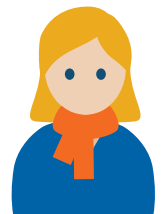

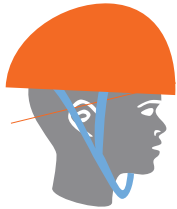
